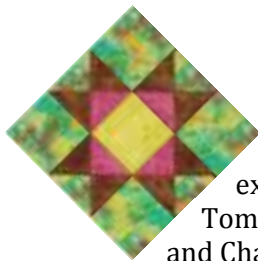


Thank You

Regular meeting September 9**

Vice President Marlyn M called the meeting to order and recognized Rita M's daughter, Debbie, as a guest. The minutes of the August 12 regular meeting were approved as written in the Newsletter. The treasurer's report was also approved.

2nd VP Michael M told about the recent trip to Kansas City that Micki U, Norma Jeane F, Kathy C, Rita M, Millie M, Karen G, Donna R, and he took to view an art quilt exhibit at the Belger Art Center.

He also stated that the fall luncheon will be October 14. The program will be Juanita Yeager who will present a trunk show and power point presentation.

Program co-chair Micki U stated that the November a.m. workshop will be with Pam F of Quilter's Harvest who will teach a strip quilting technique using "jelly-roll" fabrics. The Guild will provide the pattern. Members' cost is \$10 plus fabric. Pam will have "jelly rolls" available, but members may bring their own strips. 39 strips measuring 2 ½ x 42 are needed for a lap size quilt.

Newsletter Micki U reminded members to let her know if you don't receive the newsletter either by e-mail or U.S. mail.

Librarian Mary Vale J announced that she was pulling books or magazines to be sold at the Bazaar.

Friendship Katherine S drew Ruth Ann T name, with Sarah D as the alternate. Paula S had her paper pieced pattern available.

Door prize Dorothy R had fabric for Sarah D, Paula S, and Lavonne B.

Hospitality Janie C had labeled the totes and reorganized the supplies in the closet.

Door greeter (and name tag police) Lois H collected \$1.75 in fines.

Quilt Show 2008 co-chairs Betty L and Kathy C announced the names of the vendors and had sign up lists for the various positions at the show. Members should wear seasonal vests, jewelry, etc for the show and, of course, their name tags. Thursday night at 7 pm. the frames, tables, and bazaar items will be delivered to the YMCA. Quilts should be brought to the Y by 9 a.m. Friday. The Bazaar area was summarized and members were asked to continue making items, including home-made breads. Food items should be well wrapped in clear wrap, tied, and labeled with a price. All items should be priced by the maker and can be brought to the Y on Friday.

Quilt Show 2009 co-chair Norma Jeane F had some completed 2009 Raffle Quilt blocks completed to show and packages to distribute to members. Members were asked to please return the blocks at the October meeting. If there are questions concerning the block construction or color lay-out, please contact NJ.
