Here is the recipe for the cookies that were so popular at the November meeting.

DIABETIC COOKIES

1 $\frac{3}{4}$ c flour	1 egg
1 tsp cinnamon	1 c applesauce
$\frac{1}{2}$ tsp nutmeg	$\frac{1}{2}$ c raisins
1 tsp soda	1 c All-Bran
$\frac{1}{2}$ c oleo	$\frac{1}{2}$ c nuts
$\frac{1}{2}$ c sugar twin or splenda	

Sift together flour, cinnamon, nutmeg, and soda in a large bowl. Mix together oleo, sweetener and egg. Mix in dry ingredients alternately with applesauce. Fold in bran, raisins and nuts. Drop on greased sheet and bake at 350 degrees.
