## **COUNTRY PATCHWORK QUILT GUILD REGULAR MEETING July 9,2013**

President Kathy C called the meeting to order. The Minutes and the Treasurer's Report from the last meeting were approved as written in the July Newsletter.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**GUESTS:** Kathy C welcomed Charlene C and Amie S.

**LIBRARIAN:** Dorothy R reported the donation of three pattern books and another book called "Stack and Whack-A-Pedia".

**CHARITY:** Norma Jeanne F and Marlyn M reported that the "Workday" in June was a huge success. Several nice lap quilts were completed.

**QUILT SHOW:** Bobbie Jo P reported that the opportunity quilt was shown at the Boonville Heritage Days on June 22<sup>nd</sup>. \$56.00 in raffle tickets were sold; however the entry fee was \$50.00. We will not take the quilt to Boonville next year. The quilt was shown at Alma and brought in \$70.00 with an entry fee of \$20.00. The quilt will go to Norborne for the "Soy Bean Festival"; to Marshall for Santa Fe Days; then to Waverly, Columbia and Sedalia. More Fat Quarters are needed- give these to Bobbie Jo.

Marty W reported that those who help hang the quilts on the Friday before the show can either donate \$5.00 or bring a pot-luck dish for lunch. She will provide a sign-up sheet. Marty also asked members who are handing in money for any reason to place it in an envelope and mark accordingly. Janet E needs Bazaar items and Karen G needs Silent Auction items.

**FRIENDSHIP BLOCK:** Beth C thanked members for making blocks for her. Kathy C explained her block. Karen G's name was chosen for next month.

**DOOR PRIZES:** Door prizes were won by Marty W, Katherine S, Karen G, Charlene G, Bobbie Jo P, Norma Jeanne F, Marilyn S, and Mary Pat W.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Members should give recipes to Marty W by September.

**MISC.:** There will be a quilt show in Fayette on August 3 from 9:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. at Central Methodist Church. The theme is "Quilts received as Wedding gifts".

**SHOW AND TELL:** Karen G showed a large brown and beige "White Work" which had been quilted by Lynn O. Barbara D showed a WOW bag; a bargello quilt done in red, black, gray and white; and a T-Shirt quilt. Charlene C {Kathryn J's daughter} showed two large scrappy quilts done in various colors. Suann C showed a large quilt done in reds, browns, teal, and gold and a stack and whack quilt done in dark colors. Beth C showed a quilt she called "Heart of My Heart" done in reds, pinks, and white. Marty W showed a large quilt done in lime green, white, blue and red. Bobbie Jo P showed a table runner in a tumbling block pattern. Norma Jeanne F and Bobbie Jo P showed the progress of their Kansas City Star Block of the Month projects. Norma Jeanne F also showed a "One -Block-- Wonder" quilt done in reds, greens, pinks, and blues and a small quilt done in dark colors. Paula S showed a silent auction contribution.

Paula reminded members that the August meeting will feature Kelly Ashton who will lecture on the "Pleasure/ Pitfalls of Precuts". The luncheon in October will feature Kathy Freshwater, "Traveling the Freedom Path...Quilts and the Underground Railroad". She then introduced Lynn O who lectured on "Preparing Your Quilt for the Long Arm Quilter".

The meeting was adjourned and later refreshments were served.

**COUNTRY PATCHWORK BOARD MEETING**

In attendance: Kathy C, Karen G, Bobbie Jo P, Betty L, Janet E, Marty W, Norma Jeanne F and Mary Pat W.

Bobbie Jo P reported that the quilt was taken to Boonville for Heritage Days on June 22<sup>nd</sup>. Although \$56.00 was brought in, there was an entrance fee of \$50.00. It was agreed that the quilt will NOT be taken to Boonville next year. The showing at Alma brought in \$70.00 with a \$20.00 fee. The quilt will be taken to Norbornne for the "Soy Bean Festival" on August 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> and to the "Santé Fe Trails Days" in Marshall on September 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> and the Waverly "Apple Festival" also in September. Marty W has volunteered to make a short presentation at the State Fair on Monday August 12<sup>th</sup>. This will be another opportunity to show off the quilt and to sell raffle tickets.

The members discussed the need to locate other venues for showing the quilt and selling raffle tickets for next year.

Members were reminded to bring in "Fat Quarters" for Gayle S. Janet E needs bazaar items and baker's racks on which to display them. Norma Jeanne F needs props such as trunks, sewing items, ironing boards and irons, mannequins on which to display Civil War Costumes, quilt racks, dried flowers and pumpkins etc.

Betty L reported on Tourism. She stated that "Missouri Life" is doing a double spread. 2,000 trifolds were sent to quilt guilds and quilt shops.

Marty W stated that she is sending out follow- up letters with trifolds to the vendors.

Bobbie Jo P reminded members that quilts donated for exhibit should be clean, with no damage. A label should be attached to each quilt with a safety pin not a straight pin. Quilts should be folded inside out so the labels will show.

The quilts will be hung on the Friday before the Quilt Show. For those helping, bring a covered dish or donate \$5.00 to Marty W to cover the cost of food.

Good strong skirt hangers are needed for hanging the quilts.
