### CHARITY QUILT WORK DAY JUNE 11, 2013 9:00 TO ?

The Saline County Cancer Center is running very low on quilts to give to people going through cancer treatment and contacted our Guild for assistance. So..... the Board decided to have a work day on June 11th instead of the regular meeting.

Quilts should be no more than 42" wide so the width of a piece of fabric can be the backing. They can be tied instead of quilted.

On the 11th, bring your sewing machines, thread, the usual supplies necessary, extension cords, plugs, cutting mats, cutters, irons/boards, etc. Everyone can help. We need people to press also.

In order to turn out several quilts, we will use very simple designs and 2 1/2 inch strips or Jelly Rolls with coordinating yardage. Any yardage you bought, don't like, can't use again or just want to donate to the cause would be appreciated. Donations of lap size small quilts are also welcome.

We will have some kits, patterns, and ideas for members to work on.

Of course, snacks are always welcome and we will have a pot luck for lunch.
