Easy Scallop Borders

Learn how to finish your borders with a flourish. This easy method does not involve bias edges.

Supplies

EZ scallop tool (available at Joann’s- use a coupon)



A quilted item at least 18” square (This could be just two pieces of fabric layered with batting and quilted as long as it is 18”)

Chalk marking pencil in a color that is easy to see

Enough fabric to cut bias binding for your piece

Mat, ruler, rotary cutter

Sewing machine in good working order with 1/4" foot

Iron

Scissors

Needle and thread to hand stitch the binding
